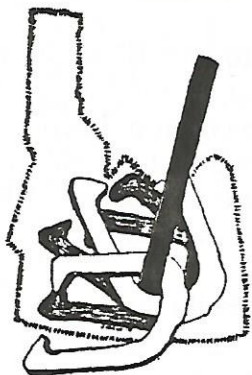

Be sure to include the number in your party who will be attending the Annual Banquet Saturday evening. It will be held at the Asia Cafe, 7th & Main, Caldwell for \$8.00 per person. Chinese and/or American cuisine served family style.

There is space for self-contained RV's at Memorial Park but there are no hook-ups. The Caldwell Campgrounds with full hook-ups is one mile north of Caldwell at Exit 26. Call 54-0279 for reservations.

Pocatello. The brand new Brick Thompson Horseshoe Complex in Ross Park awaits your inspection and participation in what is fast becoming The FUN Tourney of the whole year -- the Idaho State Doubles Championship.

Ross Park and the courts are easy to find. Just leave I-15 at Exit 67, the southmost Pokey exit. Take a right (from the north) off the Freeway and your next right is 5th Street (one way) going back north (actually northwest). It's just a few blocks to Fredregill Road which takes off to the left at a 45 degree angle. Take Fredregill across to 2nd Street where you will see a Ross Park sign directing you left. Watch for the old horseshoe courts on your right and the overnight RV parking on the left. Park in this general area. The new Brick Thompson Complex is not visible from the road (2nd Street) but is hidden by a brushy hedge west of the original Ross Park Courts.

If you're coming from the west on I-84 you hit I-15 just east of Chubbuck and head

The ISHPA **Annual Business Meeting** usually held with the Annual Banquet on Saturday will be held this year on **Friday evening** at the Park at the bandstand next to the horseshoe courts starting at 7 PM.

To reach the courts at Memorial Park leave I-84 at Exit 28. Coming from the East, take a left at the bottom of the hill at the traffic light onto 10th Avenue. Go to Grant Street. Turn right two blocks and you will end up at the entrance to the Park. Coming from the North turn right at the stop light onto Grant Street. Turn right two blocks to the Park.

Men's classes will be 12-man "round robins," depending upon the registrations. All classes will pitch both days. Men's A & B Classes will start at 9 AM both Saturday and Sunday. Check in time will be 8:30. Juniors, Women, and 70-plus, 30 footers will also start Saturday morning. The remaining classes will start as the other classes finish. A & B will pitch to 40 points with no limit on shoes. All other classes will pitch 40 points or 50 shoes which ever comes first.

south (toward Salt Lake City) to Exit 67.

Of course you should be coming down to Pocatello from Idaho Falls where **the Bob Mitchell Classic** will be held the day before the Doubles Championship (Sat Aug 22).

You could stay in Idaho Falls Saturday night if you wanted and drive the 50 miles to Pokey Sunday morning. Sign-in time in the Gate City is 9:30 with pitching to start at 10 sharp. Plenty of time.

There are motels and RV space near the courts in Pocatello. Jerry & Barb Williams will be happy to help you with your arrangements. Call them at 232-1327 -- leave a message if they are not there. **DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP** rules are printed elsewhere in this issue. We asked for input in setting the rules but got no response. Setting **DOUBLES** rules will be one of the items on the agenda at the Annual Business Meeting in Caldwell the Friday evening before the State Championship.

GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

Courteousness, consideration and fairplay are the heart of the good sportsmanship that add so much to the enjoyment of the game of horseshoes. Often discourteous conduct is more a lack of thoughtfulness than any intentional misconduct. The important thing is to **think**.

Make no distracting movement or noise while your opponent is pitching -- that is, no filing or clinking of shoes, talking or standing ahead of the stake (no matter how far to the side you might stand). Stand **behind** the stake while waiting your turn.

Never pick up or move a shoe until agreement has been reached.

The player who scores calls the score to the scorekeeper. If the scoring player fails to call his points to the scorekeeper, remind him. Don't you call it.

Do not step **on or over** the foul line when delivering your shoe.

1992 STATE DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

1. Classes, no handicap. This is a sanctioned tournament. ALL fees returned, plus added money.
2. Preregistration. Entry with check (\$10.) must be received no later than Thursday August 20th at 925 Shale Pocatello 83204. No phone entries. Include your partner's name on your entry. If you do not have a partner, let us know with your entry and we will provide one. If you have not established an official ringer percentage indicate that on your entry too. You will be required to pitch 100 shoes to establish that.
3. This will be a *no walking* doubles. Pitchers do not change ends but they may exchange shoes if the wish. Check-in time is 9:30 AM. Pitching starts at 10 AM sharp.
4. High average pitcher pitches against the high average pitcher. High pitchers always pitch from the south end.

5. Scorekeepers will be paid *after* the game rather than before. *Losers pay \$1.00.* It's far more difficult to keep doubles scores. It may be necessary, we hope not, for players to keep their own scores in some games.

DOUBLES RULES for 1993 will be discussed at the Annual Business Meeting in Caldwell Friday evening before the Championship at the courts in Memorial Park. Maybe a committee will be appointed to work out the details. Your input is needed and will be appreciated.

"A motion was made by Leona Riese (Fairfield) and seconded by Shirley Watson (Kellogg) to raise all tournament fees by fifty cents (\$.50) to finance FOUR DEAD! Motion passed. The money to be sent to the Treasurer. Although no motion was made, the general consensus favored the State making up any shortage if this does not cover publication costs."

Tournament attendance has been a bit less than last year so revenue is down and this is placing an undue burden on the Association. **So please send your Club Check today to the Secretary-Treasurer at Route 5, Box 189, Rupert 83350.** If you would rather pay for FOUR DEAD! some other way that can be worked out at the Annual Business Meeting in Caldwell the Friday evening before the State Championship. But until some change is made each club is obligated to pay its fair share.

The President's Message

Thanks to all those who bought the 50-50 computer tickets and those who sold them too. We now have a complete system with storage and printer — and a program provided by the Caldwell Club. It should be up and running by the time you receive this issue of FOUR DEAD! A special thanks to Al Lee, Jerome, for his efforts in that regard.

I have ordered the computer program offered free by NHPA to State Charters and anyone wanting a copy of that program contact me.

Plans and preparations for the two big August State Tournaments are well underway. It looks like both the State Doubles in Pocatello under the direction of Jerry Williams and the State Singles Championship in Caldwell under the direction of Ralph Warthen assisted by Gary Kollmann are going to be outstanding this year and we certainly hope you will be present for the festivities.

We are trying something new this year. The last two years we have had a preliminary annual business meeting the Friday evening before the start of the State Tournament. Its purpose was to take some of the pressure off the regular Annual Banquet and Business Meeting always held Saturday evening after the first day of play. This year the regular Annual Business Meeting will be held Friday evening 7 PM at the band shell adjacent to the horseshoe courts. That will give us more time to enjoy and visit at the Saturday night banquet.

Give some thought to electing a new president for a multiple year term (2-3 yrs). I visited with the Washington President recently and he said they had found there were many advantages to the longer term. There are several other points of business which were recommended for consideration at the Kellogg meeting and which were to have been brought to the membership at the next annual meeting that just didn't make it. In addition to the longer term for president, there was the thought of having three vice-presidents, one for each of our three regions. Has the dividing

line between Southeast and Southwest districts ever been officially set? There's the issue of increasing entry fees to \$10. Most seem to favor that but it is something we must vote on. Fifty cents of the increase goes to support FOUR DEAD! and \$1.00 goes to the gals who do our bookwork for us and without whom we would have very little. Several Clubs have overlooked sending to the Treasurer the \$.50 *per player* we voted on last year to support FOUR DEAD! We certainly should decide on preregistration (or "intent to pitch") one way or another so that we will all be consistent.

In addition to the election of officers we must decide where and when the 1993 Doubles and Singles Championships are to be held. Rules for the conduct of the Doubles Championship should be set or a committee appointed to do that job. There's a lot of business to be accomplished at the Annual Meeting. Do you have any suggestions to improve Idaho Horseshoes? If you do, let me know now.

It would be great if every club could pick up even just two or three new members each year. Pocatello is leading the way. We're way down in Junior Memberships.

Good pitching to all. Hope to see you at the State Tournaments.

We do get all Idaho sanctioned scores because the State Statistician, Marj Chapin of Twin Falls, does her job so well and we sure appreciate that! A Story of the WORLD

Columbus, OH. There were two record broken at the 1992 WORLD. First, the total prize money exceeded \$125,000 and second, the total entries were 1700. Host Ohio had 482 pitchers, more than half their membership. PA had 212 pitchers on hand followed by IN with 105 pitchers.

The 1990 World in Georgia had one Idaho entry, Olon Crandall, then of Mountain Home and now of Boise. In Beloxi, Mississippi in 1991 there were five Idaho pitchers, the Lyle Andersons of Idaho Falls and Lou Brock of Malad. This year in Columbus there were three Idahoans, one of them the Grand Dame of Idaho Horseshoes, Rose Kubal of St. Anthony, Bob Mitchell, former Shelley publisher and holder of Idaho B, C & D State Horseshoe Championship titles and finally Lou Brock of Malad. Next year with the WORLD being in our own back yard at Spearfish, SD we expect Idaho to be well represented — at least 10% of our membership should be there.

The classes went all the way to ZZ and the pitching went on almost around the clock but that's what it takes when you've got 1700 pitchers. It was late in the evening toward the end when two of the 36 Class P pitchers met for the playoff. Each had lost only two games in the long, grueling series. You could follow the posted score you could see from a distance. It was nip and tuck at first with each pitcher throwing 50+% which was somewhat over their averages. It was approaching midnight. Slowly the older gentlemen started to pull ahead. Two dead one, two dead one, then, two dead three — 10 to 18, 12 to 28, 13 to 31 the scoreboard read. Then all of a sudden the scorekeeper threw up his hands. The scoreboard score and the scoresheet score were reversed. Both players knew that the scoreboard score they had been watching was correct at 13-31,

With sportsmanship the reversal should have been corrected and the game continued but the low man objected vehemently and would have none of it. Finally NHPA President Louchs and NHPA Secretary Roberts were called in to settle the dispute. After considerable discussion back and forth the ruling was made that the game should be replayed, started over. It was 2 AM, the 18 point lead was cut to zero, from 13-31 to 0-0 and a new game began. The low man, all fired up by the gift of 18 points, soon was the Class P Champion of the World in horseshoes. In second place was Bob Mitchell of Shelley.
