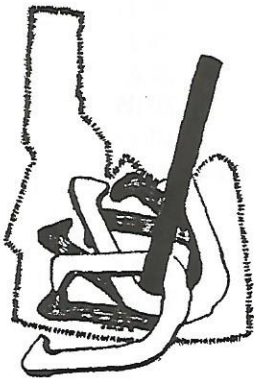

### KOLLMANN # 1

#### '91 State Champ Repeats in '95

#### MARQUEZ # 2

**T**he 1995 State Horseshoe Championship is now history. There were 79 participants at the outstanding Jerome event directed by Henry Reid. Gary Kollmann, Nampa, the 1991 State Champion, came out on top for a second time. It took a 48.28% average to cop the '91 title. This year it took him 53.28% to gain the same title.

Kirk Jacobsen, Mountain Home, took Class B with a record of 9 wins and 2 losses throwing 39.52%. Bill McAughey of Pocatello captured the Class C title with 5-1 at 31.33%.

Dean Blake, the Sun Valley Flash, (7-1, 30.85%) took Class D honors after a playoff with Tony Marquez of Idaho Falls. Tony Apodaca of Jerome nailed E at 7-0 and 28.75%. One and two in Class F went to Mike Thompson (6-1 at 25.14%) and Reed Holverson (5-2 at 20.85%) both from Idaho Falls. Mike T. is in his first year of pitching. The G Championship went to Ron Lloyd of McCammon with 5-1 and 20.29%. Idaho Falls sent only four pitchers to the State Championship but they all placed — one first (Mike) and three seconds (Clyde, Tony & Reed).

Don Moser of Inkom (4-2, 65%) and Ralph Warthen (4-0, 46.25% average with a high game of 55%) of Caldwell were victorious in the 30' A & B Championships respectively. In the 30' Class A, Bill Brown threw a 77.5% game which was high for the whole tourney and high game for the entire year in Idaho. Correct me if I'm wrong.

Linda VanGorder of Fairfield captured the Ladies State Championship again, for the umpteenth time, with 6-0 at 52.33%. In the B, Carrie Dee Gardner of Pokey took top honors with 6-0 and 39%. Ryan Lloyd, McCammon, took the Junior Boys with a record of 3-1 and 25%.

Sunday evening when all the pitchers had holstered

their shoes, the scorekeepers had returned their clipboards and the statisticians had completed their computing, the State Championship placements were: Champion Gary Kollmann, runner-up Charlie Ault, 3rd, Clyde Marquez and 4th, Louis Piva. However on the following Tuesday, the Director received a surprising letter which changed most all of that and resulted in the following *final official placements*: Champion Gary Kollmann, runnerup Clyde Marquez, Idaho Falls, 3rd Louis Piva, Challis and 4th, Dave Spears, Boise.

The letter to the Director had come from Charlie Ault, now of Richfield and the 1993 and 1994 Idaho State Champion, and it read in part, "Dear Henry, I am returning the second place envelope and it's contents . . . . I feel under the circumstances that I don't deserve it . . . . Consider someone else to receive the award. No need for you to respond back. Thanks." Signed Charlie Ault.

The NPHA Rule 4 *Pit Preparation and Maintainance under Section A* was the source of the problem. The rule reads in part, "During a game, a contestant shall not step on, mash, or otherwise repair any of the substance in the scoring area of the pit without the consent of the opponent or a tournament official. . . . ." The Director had emphasized this particular rule to all pitchers Saturday morning before the beginning of tournament play.

In the 11th game of the Championship class on Sunday with Kollmann enjoying a comfortable lead, Ault was called for digging up the pits. As most pitchers know, such delays, as between games, can throw one's timing off. After some discussion, officials permitted the game to proceed, then they had second thoughts. After further deliberation and discussion, it was decided that the only fair thing to do was to throw out the game in which the infraction occurred and repitch it. This was agreeable to both contestants. Kollmann won that game, Ault had won the previous game. The two parted with a handshake. The good sportsmanship of both Gary and Charlie throughout the entire event was a tribute to each of them as well as to the character of Idaho Horseshoes. Charlie's letter to the Director which brought about the change in the final official standings is a further indication of that fair play.

**It's A New Record**

It was a long, long game—136 shoes. One pitcher threw a sizzling 94.85%, the other threw a mere 88.97%. These were not ordinary pitchers. That combined total percentage of 91.91% is believed to be the highest single game combined percentage ever recorded. Obviously these two pitchers were not you and me.

Imagine, if you can, your throwing a total of 121 ringers (including 53 doubles) in a single game and losing—scoring only 15 points. Under such circumstances you'd know your opponent had pitched one hell of a game. Right? He threw 129 ringers out of 136 shoes, that's an average of 94.8%.

That game took place at the 2nd Annual Midwest Six Pac Invitational Tournament in Hillsboro, Missouri on April 23rd this year. The contestants were Walter Ray Williams, CA, past World Champion and Alan Francis, MO who was to become the 1995 World Champion (for the third time). It was Francis who threw the 94.85%. Study the score sheets on the following page. There's never been another like it.

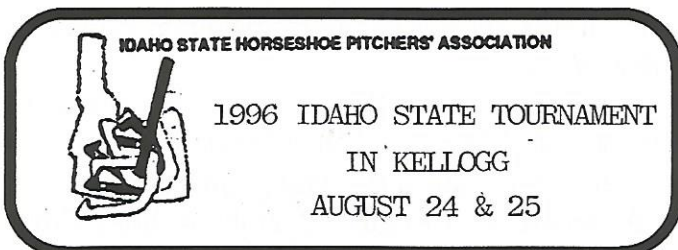

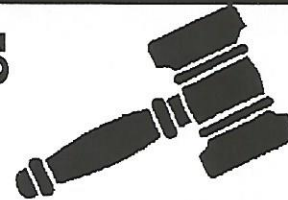

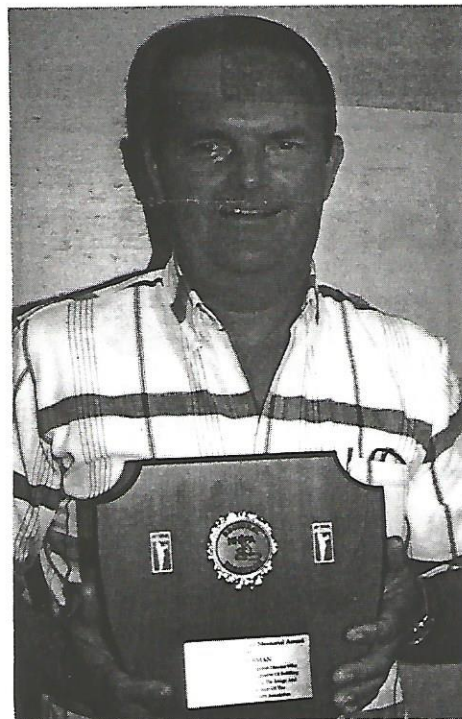

**ISHPA Annual Meeting 1995****MINUTES**

Jerome, Idaho

On Friday, August 25, 1995, President Wayne Durnil opened the 1995 ISHPA annual business meeting by introducing the current year officers. Jackie Durnil will be taking the minutes in the absence of Secretary-Treasurer Bonnie Stutzman.

MINUTES: The 1994 minutes were read and approved.

TREASURER REPORT: \$2,474.53 in checking and savings accounts. FOUR DEAD! has a balance of \$156.30 on hand. Membership is 171 adults and 5 juniors.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: President Durnil brought up proposed By-Law changes for the selection of the Idaho State Tournament site. The committee appointed by President Durnil consisted of Gary Kollman, Jess Lyda and Clyde Marquez. This committee proposed By-Law changes to be voted on by the membership. Clyde Marquez, chairman of the committee, commented on the basis of recommendations by the committee. A discussion followed.

Proposal #1 - Article XI (Selection of Idaho State Tournament site) Paragraph 1. Change the second sentence to read "The Idaho State Tournament will be held in Boise each year."

Proposal #1 was defeated.

Proposal #2 - Article XI (Selection of Idaho State Tournament site) Paragraph 1. Change the second sentence to read "The state is divided into three sections: North, East and West. The North section is that area West of U.S. Highway 93 South from the Montana border to Stanley and North from a line drawn due West from Stanley to the Oregon border. The East section is that area East of U.S. 93. (Exception: Jerome is included in the East section.) The West section is that area West of U.S. 93 and North from the southern border of the State to the line West of Stanley. If possible, tournament sites will be alternated between the northern, eastern and western section of the state." Henry Reid asked for a clarification of which clubs would be in each section. President Durnil explained that the North would currently consist of Kellogg, Coeur d'Alene, Lewiston, Challis and Salmon. East: Idaho Falls, Pocatello, Inkom, Rupert and Jerome. West: Twin Falls, Fairfield, Mountain Home, Boise, Nampa and Caldwell.

Proposal #2 was passed.

President Durnil stated no reports were received from any clubs interested in bidding for World Tournament.

NEW BUSINESS: Selection of 1996 State Singles site - Don Heidt submitted a bid for Kellogg to host the 1996 State Tournament. Jess Lyda moved that the club accept Kellogg's bid (2nd by Charlie Ault). Motion passed. Dean Curry made

a motion (2nd by Betty Lyda) that the city that gets the bid have the right to hold the tournament on Labor Day week-end or the week-end before. Motion passed. Don Heidt asked if he had to make that determination now. Wayne advised him to select a date before the next edition of the FOUR DEAD!

Selection of the State Doubles site - Bob Zausch proposed Pocatello for the State Doubles. Motion by Dan Rollins (2nd by Don Moser) to accept Pocatello's bid. Motion passed.

Comments were requested by Wayne regarding handicapping. Some discussion was held. Motion by Dean Curry (2nd by Lynn Johnson) to leave handicapping to the discretion of tournament director. This does not apply to state tournaments. Motion passed.

Scorekeeping fees - Clarence Spears (2nd by Dean Curry) to leave as is at 25 cents.

Wayne read a letter from Bonnie Stutzman suggesting that the state pay the cost of mailing plaques, class plates and patches, also sales tax when appropriate. Dean Curry (2nd Dan Rollins) made a motion to accept Bonnie's suggestion. Motion passed.

Tournament Director of the Year presentation was made by President Wayne. Ralph Warthen was the recipient.



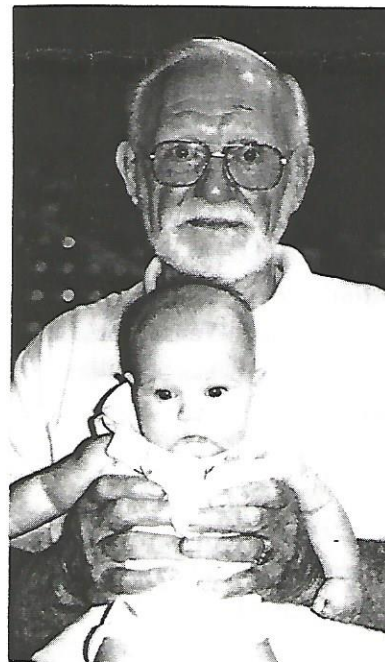

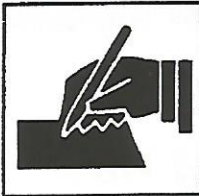
