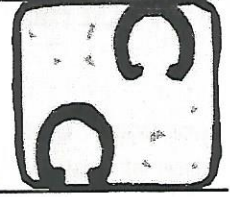

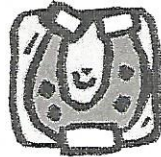

President's Message:



Hello fellow horseshoe pitchers, welcome to a New Year of horseshoe pitching. As we begin the new season there are many announcements that need to be passed along. Since we did not send out a newsletter at the end of 2001, many things need to be mentioned.

To start off, I am now a married man, as several of you already know. My wife's name is Kimberly and is a wonderful lady; she also supports me 100% in horseshoes.

We were not able to publish a newsletter at the end of the 2001 season because there was not sufficient funds in the newsletter account. We only had about \$60.00 and it usually takes a minimum of \$150.00 to put them out. I think it would be great if we could get back to doing at least three newsletters per year, this way we would be covering the beginning, middle, and end of the season.

We had three new state champions for the 2001 season; they included: Jim Switzer (of Incom), in the elder's division, Linda Pickering (of Nampa), in the women's division, and Gary Opper (of Boise) in the men's division. I wish to congratulate all of these people on their division titles.

The officer positions up for re-election were the sec./treas. And the first vice president. Marge Chapin retained her position as sec./treas. While a new 1st vice president was voted in. His name is Bobby Faulkner of Pocatello. Mike Zahn previously held this position.

Bobby Faulkner, who is the co-tournament director with Jim Price in Pocatello, has been undertaking a huge task. Their club has decided that they (with the help of others) would like to host the 2004 World Tournament. They

have the support of the Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Bureau. The tournament will be held (if accepted) in the Holt Arena at Idaho state University (ISU). He has been told that the funding has been approved for the initial bid deposit of \$15,000. I, personally think it is great that we have a city in Idaho that is of size, and offers our visitors multiple things to do during their stay while supplying a climatized indoor facility for the tournament. The bid will be presented this year at the World Tournament in Red Deer, Alberta, Canada along with three other possible bid cities.

I know that Buck Walker tried a couple of times to get the association to consider a world tournament, but due to a couple of key factors, was unable to get the support needed for the go-ahead. I would personally like to say thank you to Buck for his past efforts. Pocatello has the two key factors needed to run a world tournament and they are: the indoor facility, and a town large enough to offer the visitors things to do during their visit.

This years state Singles Tournament has been awarded to Coeur d'alene, and will be held on Labor Day weekend. That's right, Labor Day weekend. This is probably the first time this has happened in many years (if at all) for Idaho. I know that some people will not go because of the traffic, but it will now open up the doors for others who have not had the chance to go because of work schedules. The state doubles has been awarded to Pocatello, and will be held on July 6th.

Officer positions to be voted on this year at the State Singles annual meeting are: the President, and the 2nd Vice President. If you have an interest in holding one of these two positions, I ask that you please submit something in writing to Jonell Goss (newsletter Editor) for the July issue of the FOUR DEAD newsletter. Her address can be found on the newsletter cover. If you submit something, I ask that you be present at the meeting as you may be asked to speak about yourself and your reasons for wanting to hold

the position. If nothing is received, we will do the selection as done in years past.

This newsletter will not include a voting ballot form. To my knowledge there are no relevant pending issues that need to be addressed. If you have a suggestion towards changing the rules and regulations or the bylaws, please submit it to me:

Relevant issues that were passed last year that I think need to be re-surfaced are:

1. You must now (again) pitch in at least two (2) sanctioned tournaments to qualify for either one of the state tournaments. These sanctioned tournaments do not have to be pitched in the state of Idaho.
2. Any new members coming into the sport after August 1st must pitch in at least one sanctioned tournament to qualify for the state tournaments.
3. The tournament director(s) who run the state singles tournament now get to choose which weekend (Labor Day or weekend before) to run the state singles tournament rather than the members.
4. Funds will still be collected from each tournament entry (sanctioned and non-sanctioned) for the FOUR DEAD! Newsletter.
5. At the national meeting last year there was a vote on whether or not to count a 3-point touch as a ringer. The rule was voted down. A 3-point touch is not considered a ringer.

This years World Tournament will be held in Red Deer, Alberta, CANADA. Registration forms can be found on the NHPA website. The cost is \$100.00 per adult entry and \$25.00 per junior entry. Please attend if you can, and you'll see some great horseshoe pitching along with great scenery.

Once again we send snowy greetings from the Silver Valley Horseshoe Club!! We are still receiving snow, so we can only think about getting our horseshoes out.

We will not be having the "Stormin' Norman" Tournament this year. We just do not have enough manpower in our Club to hold two tournaments.

We will be hosting the Silver Valley Classic Tournament on August 10-11, 2002. Saturday will be sanctioned singles with an \$11.00 entry fee. Classes may be mixed depending on the number of entries. We will start pitching at 9:00 a.m. On Sunday, we will do the "Half and Half-Not" Tournament like we did last year. This is run very much the same as singles except for the payback. Each player starts with the same amount of money (your entry fee). As each game is played, the losing player has to give the winner 1/2 of his money. This continues through the round robin and in the end, you keep whatever money you have won. You never go broke as you only give half of what you have away if you lose. If you win, you are money ahead. The money part is all done on paper by the tournament statisticians and given back at the end of the tournament. All you have to do is pitch!!! We had a lot of fun with this last year with lots of positive feedback. This is sanctioned and classes may be mixed depending upon the number of entries. Starting time will be 9:00 am. 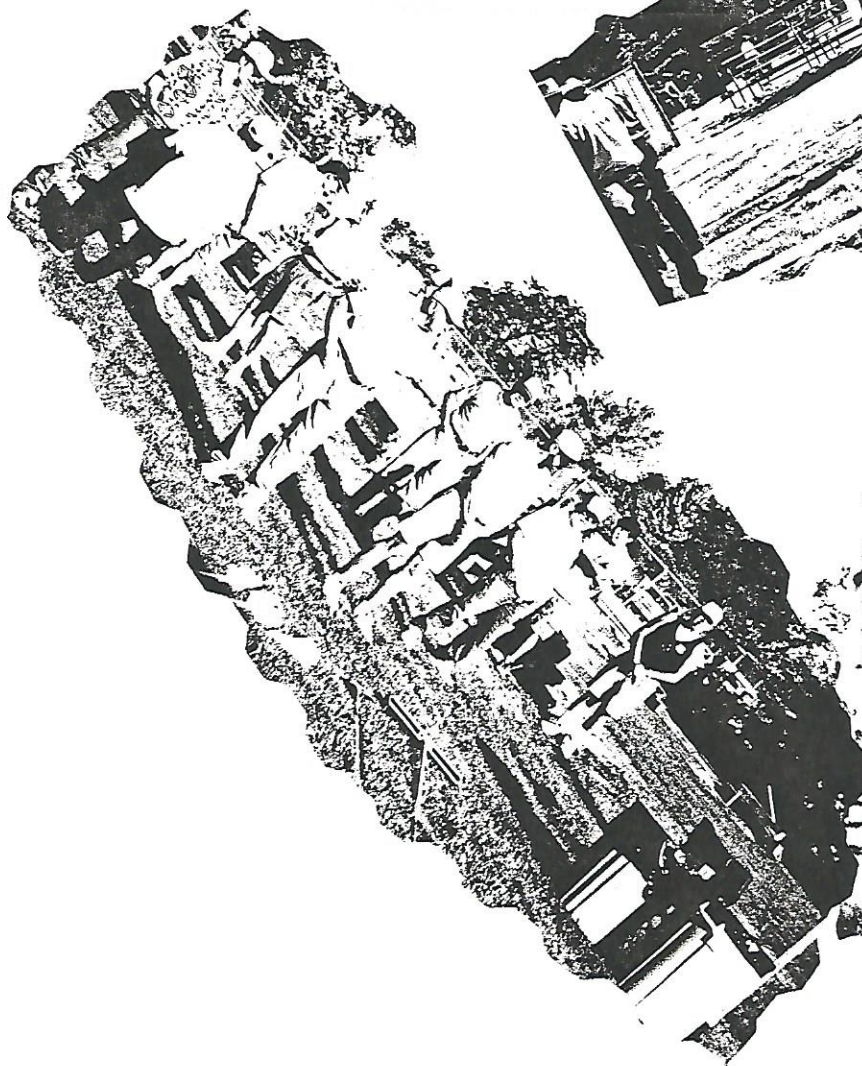
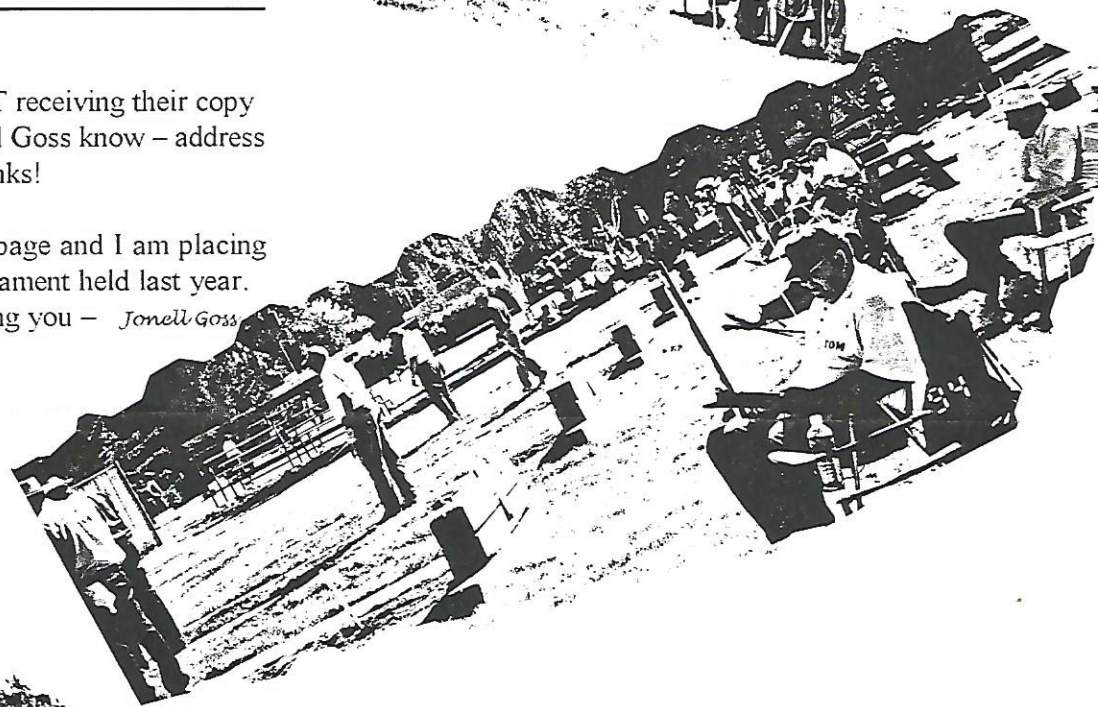
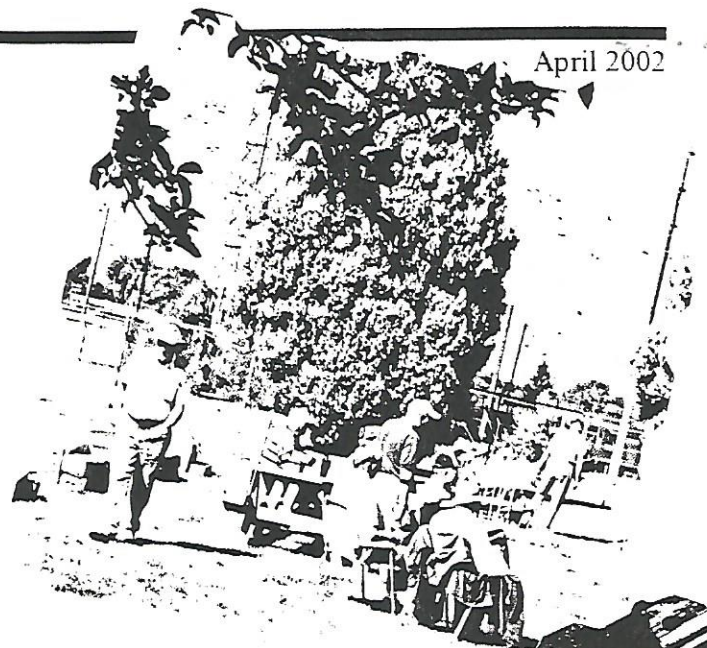

We have about 100 sites with 15-amp power, potable water and sewage removal service available about every 4 days. There is also a dumpsite and water source at the Westerner Park. Overflow and dry camping in unlimited amount is also available on site. Both powered and dry camping are within easy walking distance to the pitching site and the practice courts.

b) Lions Campground: Lions campground is downtown Red Deer beside the Red Deer River. It is a 10-minute drive to the Westerner. We have 50 sites with full service.

Entries received with a postmark after May 16th shall be put on a waiting list and pay an additional 20% penalty if later accepted into this event. NATSTATS/CANSTATS files must substantiate that you have pitched a minimum of four (4) sanctioned events in the preceding twelve (12) months, at your divisions pitching distance, prior to May 16th 2002, which is the last date NATSTATS will accept results to determine entering averages. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. Participants will be required to show their 2002 NHPA or CANADIAN membership card when checking in to pitch.

REGISTRATION FEES:

ALL ADULTS — \$100.00 ALL JUNIORS — \$25.00 U.S. FUNDS ONLY CANADIAN ENTRIES USE MONEY ORDERS REGISTRATION FEE INCLUDES SCORE KEEPING FEES NO REFUNDS AFTER May 31st, 2002

You may enter at anytime prior to MAY 16th. All averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS/CANSTATS on MAY 16th, 2002

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years or older as of July 28th, 2002. Any individual 70 years or older or physically impaired person of any age, all of which must pitch from less than the full distance platform, may enter the ELDERS DIVISION. JUNIOR DIVISION entrants must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2002 calendar year.

US RESIDENTS ONLY -INCLUDE a self addressed - stamped envelope if you would like a copy of your current average. This will be sent to you by NatStats. Canadian entries need to go direct to CANSTATS for their average.

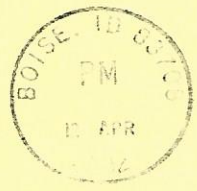
