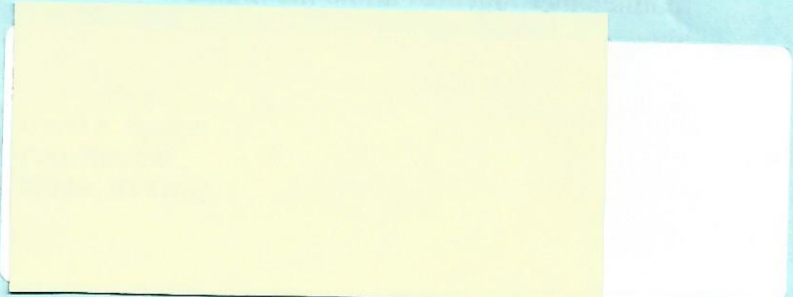

THE PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Some of these relationships may just last for the tournament or for years after that as I have experienced with many of the pitchers. For me the world tournament gave me a whole different outlook on the setup and maintenance and also doing my duties during the tournament. As expected there is always hard work involved in something that is successful as this tournament was. I would like to say great work to Bobby Faulkner, Nanette and Larry Spangler, Dan and Kathy Murray, Clyde Cobbley, Carina Bullock, Mike Bixby, Craig Young, Bob Zausch and the many others that put in the hard work to bring this event to Pocatello it will be long remembered. Further in the newsletter are the results of the Idaho Pitchers from the world tournament.

I would also like to thank my wife Kimberly Spears for providing massages during a couple days during the first week of the tournament and the donations she provided to the Make-a-Wish foundation and the NHPF. There were many happy customers in her chair. As many of you know the 2005 World will be in Bakersfield, California and as I have heard many people from here in Idaho are planning to attend.

At the state singles tournament this year in Pocatello there were titles to be gained and repeats to be had. Gary Opper and Tina Samora repeated in their respective divisions, Don Moser won the elders division and Jeff Zausch won the junior's. I would also like to congratulate all the other division winners as well.

At the annual meeting held at the Holiday Inn the Presidents position along with the 2nd VP positions were up for election this year. Bobby Faulkner was elected president and Bob Zausch was elected the 2nd VP. With Bobby being elected president this then opened up the 1st VP's position and Larry Spangler was elected to that position. Pocatello will be hosting the 2006 state doubles and since the northern part of the state declined to bid on the 2006 state singles that will now be held in Boise. If one part of the state declines to undertake the state singles it automatically advances to the next section and this is what happened. The ballot forms that were turned in throughout the year were increased from the previous years and I thank all who submitted them. The results from the two proposed items were not reported at the state meeting as I had forgotten to print them off. I am pleased to report that both proposals had passed overwhelmingly. The state singles tournament will now be ran by the state officers with the host club doing everything else at the tournament as in the past. With this proposal passing it will take a lot of the pressure off of the host club. The other proposal that had passed was the state tournament will now have no classes exceeding 8 players and everybody will get a double round robin format at minimum. This will give everybody lots of games. We didn't want anybody traveling in from a lengthy distance and have them pitch just a few games and go home disappointed anymore. With just a few more items to mention I want to take this opportunity to say a **BIG THANK YOU** to my mother-in-law Jeannie Tarr and her husband Gene Tarr for undertaking the newsletter editor's position in a time of need. I am happy to report that we have a new editor who will be taking on the challenge. His name is Jerry Smith of Nampa. Jerry is a former officer of the Northern California chapter and brings with him lots of horseshoe pitching experience and knowledge and also is a former newsletter editor. I would like to say thank you to Jerry for relieving Jeannie and Gene of this time consuming duty.

There have been some late developments since the last tournament of the season and they are. Bobby Faulkner sent me and others a letter of resignation of the newly

elected president's position. Bobby has taken on some personal challenges that will consume a lot of time and Larry Spangler also sent me an email of resignation. This then opened up the president's position and 1st Vp position. An officer's meeting was scheduled for October 30th and was held in Mountain Home. The agenda was to appoint a President and a 1st VP. I David Spears was re-appointed the President again and Gary Kollmann was appointed the 1st VP. We had also discussed other issues that will be put on the ballot form for the first newsletter of 2005.

One last item I must surface that is not horseshoe related is that my Father-in-law Gene Tarr underwent a 5-way bypass surgery on Wednesday November 10th. The last I heard before the writing of this article is that he is in pain but doing well. I personally want to wish him well as I know others do to. Hope to see everybody again in 2005.

Make-A-Wish event a soaring success

POCATELLO - Steve Young had hoped to raise \$6,000 at his fundraiser at Tough Guy Lanes Tuesday to make Cara Bott's wish come true. After all, six grand wouldn't be that hard with bowling legend Walter Ray Williams Jr. there, would it?

It wasn't.

Young, Tough Guy's owner, said Wednesday that the event actually raised \$8,461 for the Make-A-Wish foundation, more than enough to not only grant Bott's wish of going to a taping of "Eight Simple Rules," but also have some in reserve to make another Southeast Idaho kid's wish come true.

"I thought if we could raise \$6,000, that would be great. The fact that we raised \$2,000 more is just wonderful," said Young. "When I counted the money this morning, I said 'Wow, I can't believe this.' It just blew my mind. But I'm not surprised; people open up their pocketbooks and their hearts for kids."

Young said the crowd at Tough Guy Lanes to see Williams Jr. was more than 250, and he couldn't praise the audience or the performer enough for their largesse.

"Walter Ray being there was the key," Young said. "He was so fantastic. He signed autographs for everybody, and he was so accommodating when it came to pictures and things like that for everyone, for about three hours."

He also said the contributions from the World Horseshoe Pitching Championships, which brought Williams Jr. to town in the first place, was instrumental in raising the money. That, and of course, and Bott herself.

"The real neat thing was the Bott family. The fact that Cara has been with us from the beginning when we had our first press conference, that was real important. And what a sweetheart she is. People could just see the reality of this, and that just took it over the top."

The Gate City Horseshoe Pitchers Association (GCHPA) took charge in 2004 by hosting the Idaho State Singles Championship, the Idaho State Doubles Championship and The 2004 World Horseshoe Pitching Championship. The GCHPA members showed up in force, by pitching in World 2004 (the most local pitchers to ever support the World event), and by pitching in their time, energy, and money to make the World Tournament a reality. The GCHPA leads the State of Idaho in recruiting new adult members and junior members. The GCHPA will continue promoting horseshoes in 2005, with the hope of losing no current members, and the foresight to encourage new members to join. This isn't a 'good old boys club' but an evolving work of bringing horseshoes into the 21st century.

The Motto for 2005 should be "More Pitchin' and Less Ritzin'"

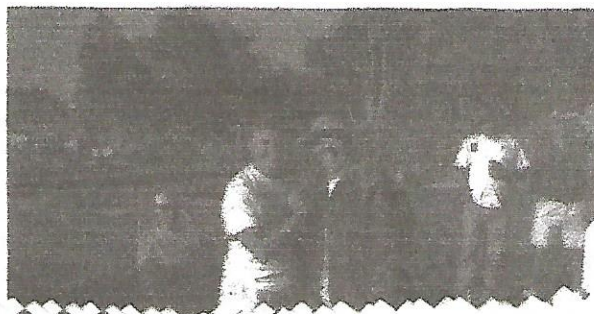
