Regional Director Message



From the Regional Director's standpoint on things from around the state, all is looking pretty good. My duties include: Promotions, sanctioning courts, and

mailing out sanctioned certificates and patches. Since the 2013 season is now behind us, we look to the 2014 season after a little time off. When possible, before February 1st, I would like all Tournament Directors to send me their 2014 Tournament schedule and the number of patches (both Tournament Champion and Class Champion) they feel they will need for the season. Once I get these tournaments in, I can soon after get the patches and certificates out. If anyone has courts that they feel need to be re-sanctioned please also contact me.

Hall of Fame Report:

In 2013 no charter members were inducted into the Hall of Fame. However, in 2014 I plan on inducting two more former Pitchers/Promoters/Organizers or Officers into the Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame was designed and set up to recognize people who have gone well beyond the norm in any of the above mentioned categories. There are a couple of people that I am looking at for the upcoming 2014 State Tournament during the Annual Meeting. Once I get enough information on these people, I will attempt to contact family and, if found, invite them to the state tournament. At present, records of Hall of Fame inductees are going to be listed on the Idaho website, and I also will keep hard copies for future record keeping. Any family member found who is associated with a deceased inductee will also be sent certificates as I did with Dean Curry's family. Sometime down the road it would be nice to have a permanent location for these records.

Treasure Valley Information:

Since going to my first World Tournament in 2006 when Don Titcomb and I traveled together, this year's tournament was the first where pitching was not my first priority. This year was a year of rekindling relationships from the past and also attempting to raise funds for the NHPF. I am happy to say that by doing what we had to call a "cash raffle" in Utah (due to certain laws within the state); we raised just about \$1,500 and another \$500+ during the Hall of Fame Banquet. During some of the meetings that I attended the first order of business focused on membership and what to do to get more people involved in the sport. One suggestion that surfaced was putting on an Intro to Horseshoe Pitching Class and run it through the

parks department and any other form of advertisement possible. On my travels home from The World my personal thoughts were focused on putting on an Intro to Horseshoe Pitching class. After a few weeks I came up with the idea of including a new member of the Treasure Valley Club, Pep Plummer, to help me out with the class. This class ran only once this fall as a test on my part to see what may have needed to be changed or not. After both Pep and I ran the class with limited participation, I believe we both feel that nothing at this time in the class needs to be changed. So starting in spring of next year, I am hoping to run this class on the first and third Monday evenings throughout the summer of each month (probably starting in April and concluding in September).

On another note I would like to recognize two people who are actively continuing with something that Don Titcomb started in the Treasure Valley a few years ago and that is the Horseshoe Pitching with the High School lifetime sports program. Pep Plummer and Floyd Eldred are the main contacts for this program along with others from Timberline High School and their instructor Larry Price. I was a part of the program for a couple of sessions in October and saw first-hand how the program works and some of the excitement that I saw through some of the kids. There is one challenge within the lifetime sports program that I noticed and that was transportation, they have to use the city bus rather than a school bus due to funding for the program because it is not a revenue generator program. I personally have decided to sponsor two bus trips for the kids next spring when the program picks up again at \$40.00 per bus or trip.

Minutes of Annual State Meeting

Date: August 24, 2013

Place: Pocatello, Idaho

Recorded by Jerry D. Smith

President Brian Poole called the meeting to order at 1:55 pm and welcomed all.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the 2012 meeting were published in the *Four Dead* and were passed out to those who needed them. The reading of the minutes was dispensed with. Bob Zausch made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Art Ross seconded. Motion passed.

Jerry Smith passed out the financial report and went over the high points. The balance at the end of 2013 is \$1,178.46. This is \$192.46 less than the ending 2012 balance. The difference probably relates to the decreased membership as we lost some 40 members this year. Keith Lewis made a motion to accept the financial report as presented. Bob Zausch seconded. Motion passed.

Vice President Glen Wessel talked about the successful season that they had in Coeur d'Alene citing the club's slight decrease in tournament participation. He is hopeful that that we can recruit more youth into our sport. He stated that he used HSMaster and struggled a bit but liked the program. He met the author of HSMaster, Kurt Whaley, at the World and enjoyed his visit.

Brent Wood reminded everyone that the 2014 schedule needs to be put together as soon as possible. Brent will also be limiting his tournament to the first 20 pitchers as

he found the double walk format cumbersome and slow. He asked that the limit be added to the schedule.

Regional Director David Spears asked to have the schedule in ASAP (December) so that he can get the patches and certificates done. He suggested that all Tournament Directors check their courts often to see that they remain in NHPA specs. For court requirements. David plans to start some classes on horseshoe pitching in the Boise area to see if he can generate more interest and gain new members. The Idaho Hall of Fame is in an off year and should have more inductees next year.

Statistician Jerry Smith stated that all went well this year.

The Sec-Treas., Jerry Smith, stated that 2013 went well although the membership fell drastically by 40 members. Jerry stated that Idaho's membership finished at 124 as compared to last year's total of 164.

President Brian encouraged everyone to promote the game and get new members involved. He spoke of the discussion at the State Officer's meeting of the 30 foot problem caused by the Canadian rule that Elders start at 65. Those Elders from Canada from age 65 to 69 cannot play in the World because our Elders start at 70. This may be a bigger problem next year with the World scheduled so close to Canada (Buffalo, NY). They also discussed the sport's growth and suggested that each club have a Promotions Director. We need to try something and Brian hopes that the membership can help. Jeff Zausch suggested a Facebook page. Brian asked Jeff if he would be willing to set up the page. Jeff stated that he would be glad to. Brian stated that that 2015 World will be in Topeka, Kansas.

Under Correspondence, Jerry said there was none

Under Old Business; Jerry Smith made motion to send the webmaster, Steve Summerlin, \$50.00 as thanks for his work. Jim Price seconded. Motion carried.

Nanette Spangler stated that she and Larry are willing to try and pick up the tournament Jackpot if people are interested. The tournament has not been held in several years, but used to be quite successful. Several people liked the idea, go for it, Nanette.

The newsletter continues to acquire Idaho pitchers' email addresses for electronic circulation, but many more are probably out there. Please get your address to either Jerry or Kay. Jerry discussed that Kay Keskinen was willing to take over as Editor of the *Four Dead*. Jerry and Kay will just trade places on the staff.

Under New Business, Brian encouraged again asked that everyone get their proposed schedule to Jerry Smith by sometime in December. Everyone should work toward not duplicating dates so pitchers can cross pollinate Idaho pitching sites.

Brian went over the 2013 World Tournament in St. George, Utah and announced the Idaho pitchers who placed in the top three in their class. Idaho had four class winners: Shawn Huntington, Pep Plummer, Denny Mead, and Melanie Poole, our First Lady.

Jerry Smith made a motion that Pocatello host the Idaho State Doubles in 2014. Jim Price seconded. Motion carried.

Coeur d'Alene was awarded the 2014 State Singles Tournament as stated in the By-Laws. They were represented as required. The dates will be the weekend before Labor Day.

Since no motion was made to change the State Tournament entry fee, the 2014 entry fee will remain at \$20.00.

Dave Spears nominated Glen Wessel for 1st Vice President. Bob Zausch Seconded. Art Ross moved to close nominations. Bob Zausch seconded. Glen Wessel was elected by acclamation.

Bob Zausch nominated Jerry Smith for Sec./Treas. Stew Brown seconded. Keith Lewis moved to close the nominations. Art Ross seconded. Jerry was elected by acclamation.

Brian thanked all of the workers who prepared the Pocatello courts and complimented the way the courts looked for this year's State.

Brian declared the meeting adjourned at around 2:30 pm.

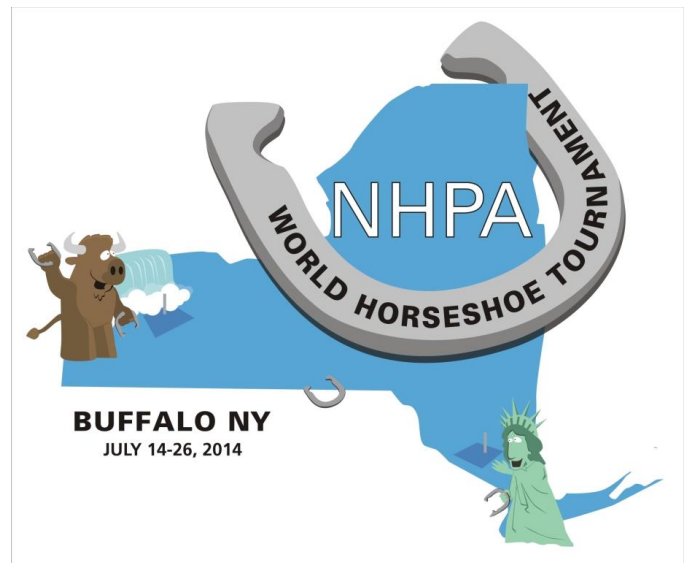
