Hello again! I hope all of you have been out and pitching some shoes! It has been a busy summer and some good and bad events have happened. One of the good events was going to the World Tournament in St. George, Utah. It was fun

to meet old acquaintances and to meet new people in the horseshoe pitching family.

Melanie and I did well in our classes. I placed 3rd in Men's I2 class and Melanie placed 2nd in Women's K class. We had a great time participating, scorekeeping, and judging. My one stat at World's was pitching a 47.5% game with 19 ringers out of 40 shoes. This was a first for me, and I now want to do it more.



Practice and concentration have helped me become more consistent, and the confidence of throwing the same every time is there.

We had 39 pitchers from Idaho at the World Tournament, and they all represented Idaho well. See results elsewhere in newsletter.

Dollars and Sense



As we all know, the dollar doesn't go as far as it used to. This year at the NHPA delegates meeting at the World Tournament it was voted to increase our national dues by \$8.00. The vote passed, so starting next year our cards will cost us \$8.00 more. The total for national

and Idaho state cards will be \$33.00. Of that \$33.00, \$25.00 will go the NHPA, and one dollar of that \$25 goes to the NHPF (the National Horseshoe Pitching Foundation). Eight dollars seems like a lot more to pay, but if you break it down, it's less than a dollar a month. If you take the change from your pockets and put it in a jar, before you know it you will have that extra \$8.00.

At the World Tournament they had a brainstorming session that anyone could attend to see what we can do to get new members into horseshoe pitching and to maintain our current membership. Both Pep and I attended these sessions, and many ideas were brought forward. One good idea is to put flyers in gas stations, coffee shops, restaurants, and any place where people go. Another idea was to set up portable courts in the mall and have some pitchers show how fun it is to pitch. There were other ideas which I will put in next spring's *Four Dead* issue.

Also held during the World Tournament was the State Officers and Regional Directors meeting, which Pep and I attended. It was discussed that each charter have a promotional director who would help promote

the sport of horseshoe pitching. Since we are so spread out geographically, it might be a good idea to have a promotional director in our individual clubs. Jerry Smith gave a presentation about league pitching. Many states have leagues; the Treasure Valley has two leagues. In these leagues we pitch three 40-shoe games. We change who we pitch against each game. It is a fun way of pitching against all our other pitchers. It is handicapped, which makes it fair for everyone. After 400 shoes, these leagues will count as a pitched tournament. Check with Jerry Smith for more info.

At this year's annual state meeting the 1st Vice President and the Secretary/treasurer positions are up for election for two-year terms. I am running again for Secretary/Treasurer, and Rodney Pickering and David Spears are both running for 1st Vice President. Note that minutes of the last annual meeting are in the Fall 2016 issue of *Four Dead*.

Idaho Bylaws Change Request

Current wording:

ARTICLE III (MEMEBERSHIP)

Any person having residence in the State of Idaho for a period of thirty (30) days may become a member of the ISHPA. Annual dues of \$25.00 for adults and \$6.00 for Juniors includes both ISHPA and the NHPA dues. Upon receipt of dues, the Secretary-Treasurer will issue a current membership card. Dues entitle membership from January 1, through December 31 of the current year. Cards purchased after October 1st, will apply to the following year.

Proposed Change:

ARTICLE III (MEMBERSHIP)

Any person having residence in the State of Idaho for a period of thirty (30) days may become a member of the ISHPA. Annual dues of \$35.00 (\$10-ISHPA; \$25-NHPA) for adults and \$6.00 for Juniors. Upon receipt of dues, the Secretary-Treasurer will issue a current membership card. Dues entitle membership from January 1, through December 31 of the current year. Cards purchased after October 1st, will apply to the following year.

Reasoning

NHPA dues were increased to \$25 at the annual Delegate meeting for the 2018 season. So we need to look into what dues we want for our association and make that change in the Bylaws at our annual meeting. It was at \$8, so it is proposed to increase the Idaho dues to \$10. And correct the spelling of "ARTICLE" and "MEMBERSHIP."



Pacific Northwest Horseshoe Tournament

After a 71 year run in Yakima, the Pacific Northwest Tournament will be held this year at Eastgate Park in Kennewick, WA. It will be the same weekend as usual, Sept. 16 and 17, and there will be a warm-up tournament on Friday, September 15. “Pep Talk” Corner

Confidence



We left off with “Winners VS Losers” and a brief explanation as to the “Why” of both in the *Four Dead* spring edition of 2017 Vol. 28 #1 (to refresh your memory). It will bring us to the next topic, which deals with “Self-confidence, Courage and Faith,” the outcome will be due to a CREATIVE MECHANISM. Our automatic creative mechanism ALWAYS ACTS AND REACTS appropriately. If man never did anything with his thoughts or ideas he envisioned, where would we be today? Our creative mechanism can and does push us to do better at all things. TRUE----- one cannot learn all there is to

know about any one subject all at once. It took us 12 years to get our education completed just so we could SURVIVE IN THE REAL WORLD! We still didn’t have all the answers, let alone know all the questions we could encounter.

The game of horseshoes certainly raises a lot of questions along the avenue of HOW COME? There are publications and videos that say “DO This----DON’T Do This.” But the “Do’s” are different for everyone. All members in our clubs try to help each other with SUGGESTIONS that you have the option to try it out in the dark. It’s an unknown until you experiment with the “New Information.” Here you must give it time to see if it helps. A few tosses and saying “Nope, it doesn’t work for me.” EXCUSE ME!!!! How many times did you fall when learning to walk! Certainly you didn’t give up --- because you are not still crawling around on your hands and knees. Little by little, piece by piece we achieve success, which elevates our ability to play the game better than before. Give the NEW information a reasonable amount of time and effort. If it doesn’t work now, perhaps it will later down the road, after your game progresses.

Setting your “Machinery for Success” Achieving confidence (Self); if you’re not willing to change, how can you expect to improve? Have faith in yourself, believe you can prevail, you’re smarter than a piece of curved metal.

LISTEN UP PEOPLE

Those who strive toward future goals – possibly unreachable -- are better able to make a realistic appraisal of present success or failure. Each event is treated as a learning and testing experience rather than as an end in itself. The outcome of a particular event is unimportant except as a demonstration of the “NEED FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENT” in a particular skill or the attainment of a particular level of competence! This attitude, essential to the development of skill, is also relaxing. Since the GOAL is to improve individual elements of performance, satisfaction is attainable without winning, and winning is treated appropriately as an unexpected, unrequired, additional joy. And with attention paid to performance and to progressive improvement in performance, winning becomes more likely.

Your expectation of success is “DETERMINED BY THE EFFORT YOU PUT INTO PREPARATION”, and your preparedness determines your victory. If you expect to lose, you are very likely to do so. If you perform worse than you expected to, the resulting dissatisfaction is a spur to greater effort in the future. If you perform better than you expected to, you are satisfied and make no effort to improve. Winners are characterized by dissatisfaction with their current status, whatever it is!
