Dollars and Sense



Hello pitchers. The 2018 pitching season has ended for most of us. The cold weather and snow have come to Idaho. There are a few brave souls who shovel the snow off the pitching lanes and pitch a few shoes.

Note that I did not keep track of many of the stats as former Statistician Jerry Smith did. I do not know who pitched the most tournaments, who had the best games, etc. If you want to know, you can go to the NHPA NATSTATS website and look at all the tournaments.

A few changes have come down from NHPA to help promote the sport and bring in new members. One of the changes is a free trial to any new pitcher who then can pitch in one league or in one tournament. No NATSTATS are required. But no old returning pitchers can use this, nor can this trial be used at World or State. The Charter secretary tracks these. The other level is a Provisional membership which costs \$15.00 and allows them to pitch in leagues and tournaments other than the World and the State. The Charter secretary adds the letter "P" to the back of the NHPA card number (for ex, 80001P). They receive NATSTATS and can upgrade to full membership at any time. The charter fees are handled by the charters and may or may not be added to this category. The tracking of these pitchers is done by the charter also, although the NHPA is discussing how to best do that. They can upgrade at any time to full membership. But no old returning pitchers can use the Provisional membership. The NHPA has not indicated if these pitchers will pay national dues or if they count towards state membership.

As you can imagine, this is going to be a big job for me to track these. Also, our state charter (ISHPA) has not decided if we are going to charge our charter fee of \$10.00. I would like to see us get new players, but at the regular membership fee of \$35.00. This would make everyone's job a lot easier. Our State membership has gone down. A LOT. For 2017 we had 100 members; for 2018 we had 80. It would be helpful if each of us could get a person to join. In our local club we ask new people to come pitch on practice and/or league night. If we can get them to come pitch in a tournament, that is good, too. For the first tournament or league we do not charge them and they get no NATSTATS, just the fun of coming out and pitching with

us. Hopefully, they had a good experience and will want to join. We give them a tournament schedule and a membership application. We also invite them to go to coffee afterwards. Our club has gained a few new members this way.

Remember, if you do not have an email address and you add \$10.00 to your membership dues, the state will mail you the full printed copy of the three issues of our "Four Dead" newsletter that come out each year. I already have the membership cards for 2019, so you can send me your dues at any time. Your 2019 card will be sent back to you.

I would like to thank Brian Poole for his 10 years of service as our State President. He did a great job, and it was a pleasure working with him.

Let's all have a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Hall of Fame Report



Three people were inducted into the Hall of Fame this year at the State Singles tournament in Meridian. They are Linda VanGorder, Gary Kollmann, and Jerry Smith. All three are all well deserving of the awards. It was my honor to induct them in our Hall of Fame.

Below is more information about each of them.

Linda VanGorder: Linda was a staple in the sport of Idaho Horseshoe Pitching until her departure in 2001. Linda

was very active in the sport while residing in Fairfield and also helped Berle and Leona Reise run events. She also served as the newsletter editor.

During her many years

as a solid Idaho pitcher Linda captured 19 women's State Championships and was one of the most dominant players throughout the state during her many years of pitching.

Gary Kollmann: Gary started pitching in the mid 80's after responding to a horseshoe pitching ad for a Caldwell league. Since that time horseshoe

pitching has been a big part of Gary's life. Gary is now a 5-time men's State Champion

has done much for the sport. Gary, while teaching and coaching when employed with the Nampa school district, included horseshoes into



his P.E. program to interest his students in the game. Gary has also run many tournaments in Nampa at Lakeview Park. Gary has been an officer of the state association and has contributed in many ways while in that role. Through Gary's and the efforts of others he setup the first and only Junior Tournament at Lakeview Park in 1997. Gary has also contributed greatly with the court improvements at Lakeview Park.

Jerry Smith: Jerry moved from California to Idaho in 2004, and soon after the move he chose to run for the ISHPA

sec/treas position in 2005. Jerry was elected sec/treas and started his newly elected role

in January of 2006. Jerry also took over as the newsletter editor as well as the statistician. Jerry, being an avid horseshoe enthusiast, took on writing books for Don Titcomb along with compiling Volume 2 of the NHPA history of the World Tournament after the passing of Gary Kline who wrote Volume 1. Jerry received the NHPA Achievement award.

Jerry has been the "go to" person for horseshoe pitching knowledge. In addition to the above roles, Jerry has been a constant promoter and organizer of the sport and brought in new members while running many tournaments. Jerry and Gary Kollmann also worked together with the Parks Department to upgrade the courts in Lakeview Park that included extending pitching platforms, adding a fence around the courts, and adding a small shed to house brooms, shovels, and other equipment. Jerry is currently the NHPA 3rd Vice President, a position serving as the sanction league director and overseeing the Junior scholarship program.

2018 Idaho State Meeting Minutes

On September 1, 2018 in Settlers Park in Meridian, Idaho, President Brian Poole called the Annual State Meeting to order at 1:50 pm. A moment of silence was held for the horseshoes pitchers who have passed away.

The minutes of the 2017 Annual State Meeting were published in last year's fall issue of *Four Dead*. Jim Price made the motion to approve the minutes of 2017 as printed, there was a second, and the motion carried.

The Financial Report was presented by Secretary/Treasurer Carol Plummer. Melanie Poole made a motion that the financial report be approved, there was a second, and the motion carried.

Reports from Officers:

Brent Wood asked to not yell at each other -- to get along and have fun pitching.

Old Business:

A motion was made by Brent Wood to pay Steve Summerlin \$50.00 for the ISHPA "pitch with us web site." There was a second to the motion, and the motion carried.

New Business:

Newsletter: It was proposed to charge \$10.00 per year to have a snail mail copy of the *Four Dead* newsletter mailed to members without an email address. This was approved. There will be a place on the member application form for the \$10.00 newsletter cost for a mailed annual subscription.

Bylaws: Voting has changed on how we vote for Bylaw amendments following the "ballot form" results from the recent membership vote. We will no longer have a mailed ballot vote. If you want to have a proposal presented for a vote at the Annual State Meeting, it must be submitted before March so that it can be put into the *Four Dead* newsletter before the State meeting. The ISHPA Executive Board must first approve the proposal. If you cannot make the Annual State Meeting, you can send your voice into the President or Secretary before the Annual State Meeting.

State Tournament Entry Fee: A motion was made by Gary Opper to have the entry fee into State remain at \$20.00, the motion was seconded, and the motion carried.

Tournament Sites for 2019:

The State Doubles tournament will be held in Hailey the last weekend in June.

The State Singles tournament will be held in Pocatello, date to be chosen later. The date will be published with the 2019 tournament schedule.

Longevity patches were presented to Rodney Pickering for 20 years, Stu Brown for 10 years, and Jayce Pickering 10 years. It was mentioned that Doug Palmer received his 30-year patch last year. Our longest pitching player is Clyde Marquez with 38 years.

Election of Officers: President – Rodney Pickering was nominated for President. No other names were presented. Rodney Pickering was elected President.

2nd Vice-President - Brent Wood was nominated, there were no other nominations. Brent Wood was elected by acclamation as the 2nd Vice President.

Hall of Fame was presented by Dave Spears, Chairman of the ISHPA HOF. Inducted this year were Linda VanGorder, Jerry Smith, and Gary Kollmann. Congratulation to these three new inductees.

A motion was made by Dave Spears to give the HOF \$100.00 per year for plaques and related expenses. The motion was seconded and carried.

The NHPA card is a combination membership of the state and the national horseshoe pitching associations. This card entitles you to participate in NHPA sanctioned play throughout the United States and much of Canada, wherever you meet the requirements of the event. You must pay your dues through the state charter where you maintain legal residence as determined by voting, taxes, and/or driver's license laws.

Dues are based on the calendar year. New members may pay next year's dues after October 1st of the current year and will be eligible to participate in sanctioned events for the final 3 months of the current year, as well as all of the next year. As a member of the Idaho Charter, you will receive newsletters and a schedule of all sanctioned and some non-sanctioned tournaments for the state.

Your pitching stats from all sanctioned events will be forwarded to the NHPA stats headquarters called NatStats. These stats are updated weekly and can be accessed through the NHPA website. To make all this possible, your NHPA card will have six digits followed by two decimals. Idaho is region 08, followed by four digits, which is your membership number. The two decimals represent the calendar year. The decimal and color of the NHPA card change each year. Your membership number will remain with you as long as you reside in Idaho and continue to maintain your membership. If you ever lose your NHPA card, the charter secretary will issue you a duplicate card free of charge. You need only notify the Sec./Treas.
