Dollars and Sense



The main topic of my article deals with the new features added to Eshoe, the online program available on the NHPA web site. Eshoe will now have a section for events called "Event Search."



If you click on "Events Search" you will be taken to a page that lists all upcoming events (or tournaments). If you want to limit the events listed, you can search by charter (state) or a range of dates or a combination of state and dates. The Idaho tournament schedule will be added as soon as I get them from the clubs. (Tournament directors, please get me your schedules!) The events schedule was designed to be input by the Regional Directors, but Pep does not do computers, so I will be helping him do it.

The new events search will be handy if you are traveling and want to see if a state has a tournament during the time you will be somewhere. Just go to the Eshoe web site, pick a state, and see if there are any tournaments on the dates you will be there. This will be so nice for many players who travel and want to do some pitching, too.

The NHPA National Statistics, or NATSTATS as we know it, will disappear with the coming of the new year. All pitching percentages will be updated as soon as the Tournament Director or your State Statistician enters the tournament data into the HS Master program. There will be no more waiting for Wednesday night to see what your ringer percentage is. You will be able to find out as soon as the tournament is posted and uploaded to NHPA. The clubs that use HS Master for tournaments will see that there is a code on the right side that you will use to submit to NHPA. I need to play around with this new program to get used to the new features. For the clubs that send their tournament results to me, please send them to me as soon as possible. The earlier I get tournaments, the quicker the players' ringer percentages will be updated and posted on Eshoe.

Through the Eshoe program you can also check to see if your dues are current and, if not, pay your dues online. The payment goes through PayPal, but note there is an "up-charge" fee for using it. If

your dues are \$35, the extra fee is \$1.32, bringing your total to \$36.12. (The PayPal transaction fee is 2.9% of the amount plus an additional \$0.30 for US purchases, which comes to \$1.32.). So, you can pay your dues online or you can also pay your dues through your local secretary or me; the membership form is near the end of this newsletter. Either way is great for me. Every three months the NHPA sends me an invoice that indicates who has paid dues either online or to me. I then send a check to the NHPA for the NHPA portion of dues that have been purchased at that time. It's a great way for the NHPA to keep track of who is paying and who isn't. With this new program it was discovered that over 100 people had been playing but had not paid their dues. Membership is down all over the country, with much of the decrease due to COVID-19. I am hoping that this virus will get under control soon so we all can get back to pitching and go to the World Tournament in Winnemucca, Nevada in July of 2021.

If you have any questions about the new programs that are coming out, you may call or text me between 9:00 am to 9:30 pm (Mountain Time). My phone number and e-mail are shown below. I will try to answer any question you have; or if I can't answer it, I will find an answer for you.

Hall of Fame Report

2020 has been no less than a challenging and learning year for all of us in different ways.

My Hall of Fame message welcomes two new inductees into our Hall, both in the "Promoter/Organizer" category.

Inductions are held every two years, so the next induction will be in 2022.

At the State Singles Championship in Pocatello we inducted Keith Lewis into the Hall of Fame. Keith was a member of the Gate City Horseshoe Pitcher's Association in Pocatello for many years.



As a member of the core group that hosted the 2004 World Tournament in Pocatello in 2004, Keith's work as the tournament treasurer not only helped make the tournament successful, but also brought recognition to the Gate City club, our state, and our state horseshoe association.

We also inducted Carlana Shove into the Hall of Fame at an event held at the Winton Park horseshoe courts in Coeur d'Alene on September 20. Several of us traveled there and met with her son, other family, along with many others from the Kootenai County Horseshoe Pitchers Association. Carlana was recognized for her many years creating and running tournaments in northern Idaho. She was also instrumental in building the horseshoe pitching complex in Kellogg.



I would also like to thank Hall of Fame Committee members Kay Keskinen and Doug Palmer for travelling to Coeur d'Alene for Carlana's induction.

Another item I want to report is that after reviewing the Hall of Fame guidelines, we noticed the criteria were unclear defining what the committee is looking for regarding our induction categories. This is our state Hall of Fame, so we are looking for members who have worked to benefit our state charter and/or members who have pitched successfully in the State Singles championship A class. The three categories (Player, Player/Organizer, and Promoter/Organizer) have been revised to clarify these criteria, with similar changes made to the nomination form. The new forms have been posted to our web site.

In conclusion I would also like to mention that Karen Wickham has stepped down from the Hall of Fame Committee and that Nanette Spangler has agreed to serve on the committee. Welcome, Nanette!

Not a “Pep Talk”



Fellow members, we're all caught up in this “World Wide Situation” which has a lot to do with the curtailment of just about every endeavor of participation of physical activity, both indoors and outdoors. The national, state, and local health authorities have mandated guidelines to help stave off

the spread of the coronavirus. Our NHPA and its many charters around the country have had to “bite the bullet” somewhat in most of the pitching cubs throughout our nation. A few clubs are still active by being able to pitch indoors and can monitor the number participating to meet guidelines. Most states have pitching facilities outdoors in regulated cities or town parks. Many are closed to all activities that have a head count of 10 or more participants, with horseshoe pitching being one of those limited activities.

The NHPA is calling for all states to get their 2021 schedules in so they can be posted on the new Eshoe program under “Event Search.” We here in our city of Boise have difficulty finding a facility to hold our local club's annual scheduled meeting to gather in order to form our local tournament schedule. The problem: we usually have more than 10 people attending. Because of our winter weather, we usually don't start pitching until the first part of April. Clubs in the south can pitch year 'round, some areas even have indoor pitching places. We here in Idaho, as well as across our entire country, will be governed by the authorities as to when our local facilities will become available, regardless of our 2021 schedule. With the advent of a vaccine on the horizon, most “common folks” likely won't be able to get the vaccine until late in June or July of 2021. The first responders, nursing homes, incarcerated people, and persons with health issues are in line to receive the vaccine according to our state authority. It may be that our (your) local park authority governed by the state authorities won't open our facilities until the vaccine shows promise of it working. Thus, everything (schedules, meetings, facilities, and tournaments) is somewhat on hold until we are told different by the health officials.

Those members who have horseshoe pits in their own backyard can practice and have a few friends

over for a get-together. Many of these backyard pits have been used to participate in online tournaments. Many states have announced online tournaments on pitching sites on Facebook. Currently, the NHPA says we can have these online tournaments count as sanctioned tournaments until the first of the year. At that time the NHPA will take a look and see if they will continue to let us have online tournaments be considered sanctioned. For the time being we are all in the “wait and see” status. In the meantime, do everything you can to remain healthy and observe your local health department's guidelines.

For right now, we are all hoping that the World Tournament will still be held in Winnemucca, Nevada next July. Like us, the NHPA is also in a “wait and see” mode. Hopefully, it's a go with a good attendance at World. In the meantime, pitch where you can, when you can, stay healthy, and cooperate with the situation. Remember, we are all in this together.

Let's try to get our 2021 schedules in as soon as possible. Carol and I will post them on the new Eshoe “Event” program on the NHPA web site. I hope we can all pitch this coming year and have some fun.

2020 Idaho State Horseshoe Pitchers Association Annual Meeting Minutes

The ISHPA Annual Meeting was called to order by President Rodney Pickering at Ross Park in Pocatello at 2:35 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2020. There was a moment of silence for the pitchers who passed away this year. Approximately 50 members were present.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept the minutes of the 2019 Annual Meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the financial report of the secretary-treasurer.

Reports from Officers

Hall of Fame – Carlena Shove will be inducted into the ISHPA Hall of Fame on September 20, 2020. Dave Spears and Doug Palmer will present the award to her in Coeur d'Alene. Keith Lewis, age 91, from Pocatello was inducted into the ISHPA Hall of Fame for his many years of administrative duties with the Gate City Horseshoes Pitchers Club and being part of the 2004 WT committee. Keith was inducted in the Promoter/ Organizer category.

Regional Director – Pep Plummer, our regional director, talked about what happens when you go to World, the check in process. He asked if anyone would be interested in taking a judging class. If there was enough interest, he would travel to the various clubs and hold a clinic.

NHPA 1st VP – Brian Poole asked to have a poll taken on what the players would prefer at World for awards: plaques or trophies. Trophies won. Brian talked about the new trading cards of World Tournament winners. He also talked about the new eshoe program to go along with the new HS Masters, that percentages would be instantaneous, and that you can pay for your 2021 membership starting October 1, 2020. The eshoe program has replaced membership cards. You can look up anyone's stats using eshoe. You can buy your card online through the eshoe program. Or you can still buy your card through your local secretary.

Old Business – To have Kay Keskinen continue to edit our newsletter and to pay her \$50.00 for next year. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to pay Kay.

New Business – Web site. There was discussion on what to do with our web site since Steve Summerlin, our previous webmaster, has passed away. There were several different options on what to do, but we could wait and see if the NHPA would step in and help or provide a new web site for the states that let Steve do theirs. We would let Kay use her web site for now, and we would revisit the topic later.

Bylaws – It was mentioned that our bylaws are out of date. Rodney Pickering said he would review them and bring them up to date. For example, we have a bylaw that states two judges must be present at State tournament. This will be updated.

Trophy Fund – it was stated that \$1.00 per person per tournament would go into the trophy fund. A cap of \$175.00 with the excess to go into the prize fund was suggested, discussion followed. A motion was made to not cap the trophy fund, but to keep all the money in the fund; then if any money was left over after the trophies are made, then that money would go into the prize fund. Motion carried. It was also discussed about having the plaques for State made into the shape of Idaho and each year have metal plates made to add on under the plaques. There was no motion on this idea.

Karen Wickham presented Carey Jennings of the Gate City Club the recruiting award of \$100.00 for bringing in 10 new members to her club. Motion was made and carried to keep this recruitment award for next year. A 50/50 drawing was held Sunday that raised \$102.00 towards next year's award. Longevity awards were handed out by Carol Plummer; Clyde Marquez received a 40-year patch.

The 2021 schedule must be submitted to the state secretary by January 30, 2021 to be put on the web site. The State Singles tournament entry fee will stay the same at \$20.00.

Hall of Fame – That the Hall of Fame awards will be limited to \$50.00 per person. Motion was made, seconded, and carried.

Tournament Sites – A motion was made to have the State Singles the weekend after Labor Day, seconded, motion failed. A motion was made to have the 2021 State Singles in Meridian. Motion seconded, and carried.

A motion was made to have State Doubles in Meridian, motion seconded, and carried. The Treasure Valley club will determine the dates of State Doubles and Singles.

Election of Officers - There were no nominations for President, so Rodney Pickering said he would remain as President for two more years. There were no nominations for 2nd VP, Brent Wood agreed to continue as 2nd VP for two more years.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:25 pm.

This card entitles you to participate in NHPA sanctioned play throughout the United States and much of Canada, wherever you meet the requirements of the event. You must pay your dues through the state charter where you maintain legal residence as determined by voting, taxes, and/or driver's license laws.

Dues are based on the calendar year. New members may pay next year's dues after October 1st of the current year and will be eligible to participate in sanctioned events for the final 3 months of the current year, as well as all of the next year. As a member of the Idaho Charter, you will receive newsletters and a schedule of all sanctioned and some non-sanctioned tournaments for the state.

Your pitching stats from all sanctioned events will be forwarded to the NHPA stats headquarters called NatStats. These stats are updated weekly and can be accessed through the NHPA website. To make all this possible, your NHPA card will have six digits followed by two decimals. Idaho is region 08, followed by four digits, which is your membership number. The two decimals represent the calendar year. The decimal and color of the NHPA card change each year. Your membership number will remain with you as long as you reside in Idaho and continue to maintain your membership. If you ever lose your NHPA card, the charter secretary will issue you a duplicate card free of charge. You need only notify the Sec./Treas.
