## Pep Talk Corner

### "Should I, or Should I?"



There are games (challenges) that require ATHLETIC performance. Regardless of the endeavor to succeed, a measure of hard work is required. Athletes learn early on to EQUATE HARD WORK with IMPROVEMENT.

It's a UNIVERSAL EXPERIENCE: the bit of hard work a BEGINNER does yields better performance, and a little more hard work produces even better results. BUT THERE IS A LIMIT TO HOW MUCH HARD WORK ONE CAN BENEFIT FROM!

Many lose their perspective and exceed their LIMIT. They come to see hard work as the only path to improvement. If they lose or fall short of a goal, they respond by WORKING HARDER! If they begin to feel lousy in their training as a result of WORKING TOO HARD, THEY WORK EVEN HARDER. Hard work becomes a kind of a SECURITY BLANKET, a reflective answer to every question, every doubt. NOTE: DON'T BE IN A HURRY TO BE WHERE YOU'RE NOT!

Athletes (players) cannot improve except by changing their RELATIONSHIP WITH PERCEIVED EFFORT. Training YIELDS IMPROVEMENT, by reducing the amount of EFFORT one experiences at any given (speed) improvement. (HOW FAST ARE YOU DEVELOPING YOUR SKILLS?)

It is said, HARD WORK NEVER HURTS ANYONE. BUT TOO MUCH OF IT CAN! Those who seem to be far better at something more than others are, are said to be GIFTED. Some say "THEY EARNED IT BY HARD WORK," or "THEY PAID THEIR DUES." BUT ----- INEVITABLY, there will be days when the participant feels lousy and even brief periods of challenging training when everything feels hard, but the overall trend SHOULD BE toward less effort at the same pace.

A trend in the opposite direction indicates that the athlete (participant) is TRAINING TOO HARD and becoming CHRONICALLY FATIGUED. If one ignores this warning and refuses to REDUCE their training load, THEIR COMPETITIVE

PERFORMANCE WILL SUFFER! Participants get into trouble when they begin to worry about what their competitors are doing and TRIES TO "OUTWORK" them. The answers to the most pressing questions that athletes face in their DAY TO DAY quest for IMPROVEMENT (SHOULD I PUSH? SHOULD I BACK OFF?) lies within them.

Should I (or) SHOULD I; WORK LESS AT WORKING HARDER?

Certain personality (or coping) traits are more common in athletes who allow themselves to become OVERTRAINED. One of their traits, perhaps not surprisingly, is COMPULSIVENESS; the other is PERFECTIONISM. Those in the know (psychologists) distinguish TWO TYPES OF PERFECTIONISM as a NEVER SATISFIED MIND -SET that can have a POSITIVE INFLUENCE ON PERFORMANCE. MALADAPTIVE

PERFECTIONISM, on the other hand, often leads athletes to engage in SELF-DESTRUCTIVE BEHAVIORS such as over training or working too hard! This type of PERFECTIONISM is known to be ASSOCIATED with LOW SELF-ESTEEM and INSECURITY. Participants who harbor a GENERAL FEELING that they are never good enough are prone to OVERTRAIN (work harder) in their UNENDING QUEST to prove their worth.

Confident athletes tend MUCH MORE to shape their "TRAINING HABITS" on the basis of RATIONAL INTERNAL OBSERVATION.

Question? Should I or Should I train LESS TO GAIN MORE, without working at it harder? There it is, see what develops.

**Treasure Valley:** Carol Plummer reports that there will be an annual meeting soon. Members will be notified of the meeting details by email, text, or a phone call.

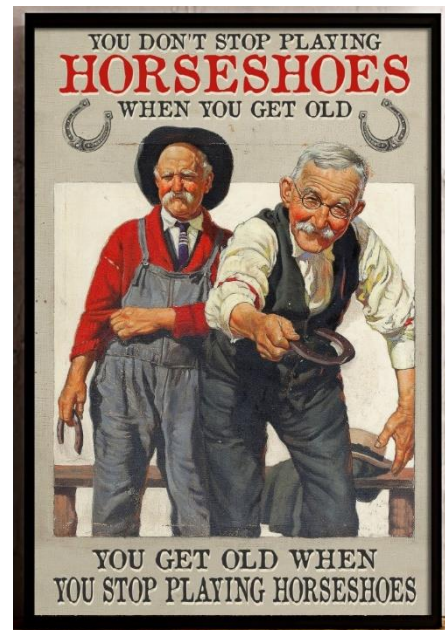

## 2021 Idaho State Horseshoe Pitchers Association Annual Meeting Minutes

The ISHPA Annual Meeting was called to order by President David Spears at Settlers Park in Meridian at 1:50 pm. Following the Pledge of Allegiance there was a moment of silence for the pitchers who passed away this year. Approximately 30 members were present.

The reading of the 2020 Annual Meeting minutes was suspended. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the minutes of the 2020 Annual Meeting as printed in the Fall 2020 issue of "Four Dead."

Secretary-Treasurer Carol Plummer reviewed the financial statement reporting that our income was lower because of the NHPA eShoe programs since dues can be paid online now. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the financial report.

### Reports from Officers

President Dave Spears thanked Rodney Pickering, Gary Opper, Gary Kollmann and Pep Plummer for their work in preparing the courts. Dave acknowledged Kay Keskinen for receiving the NHPA Achievement Award at World and Pep Plummer for receiving an award for Regional Director for 2021. Dave presented the membership award presented at World to the President of the Gate City Club, Carey Jennings.

### Old Business

1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Carey Jennings read an e-mail from Kay Keskinen about her work for our newsletter and web site. Dave Spears moved that the ISHPA pay Kay Keskinen \$50.00 annually for her job as webmaster, motion was seconded, and approved.

### New Business

**State Singles Tournament Requirement:** Carey Jennings proposed that to be eligible to pitch in the State Singles Tournament a pitcher must have pitched in at least three sanctioned tournaments with one being a State Club Tournament. The motion to amend Article XII (State Singles Tournament) point 1 was seconded, discussed, and passed by the necessary 2/3 vote as required by the Bylaws so that it now reads:

1. To qualify to pitch in the State Singles Tournament a pitcher must have pitched in a minimum of three (3) sanctioned tournaments during the past 12 months with one being a State Club Tournament unless approved by the Executive Committee.

**Bylaws:** Brian Poole presented several Bylaw amendments; all of the State Officers were emailed a copy of the proposed changes. President Dave Spears and the officers approved them as being minor wording changes and could be presented to the members of ISHPA at the meeting. The proposed amendments are as follows:

#### ARTICLE III (MEMBERSHIP)

##### **Current Wording:**

Any person having residence in the State of Idaho for a period of thirty (30) days may become a member of the ISHPA. Annual dues of \$35.00 (\$25 NHPA; \$10 ISHPA) for adults and \$6.00 (\$5 NHPA; \$1 ISHPA) for Juniors. Upon receipt of dues, the Secretary-Treasurer will issue a current membership card. Dues entitle membership from January 1 through December 31 of the current year. Cards purchased after October 1st will apply to the following year.

##### **Proposed wording:**

Any person having residence in the State of Idaho for a period of thirty (30) days may become a member of the ISHPA. Annual dues of \$35.00 (\$25 NHPA; \$10 ISHPA) for adults and \$6.00 (\$5 NHPA; \$1 ISHPA) for Juniors. **Upon receipt of dues, the Secretary-Treasurer will issue a current membership card. Dues can be paid using NHPA eShoe or the State Secretary-Treasurer. Cards can be printed from eShoe.** Dues entitle membership from January 1 through December 31 of the current year. Cards purchased after October 1st will apply to the following year.

#### ARTICLE IV (OFFICERS)

##### **Current wording:**

1. Officers of this association shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, and a Secretary-Treasurer. A Statistician shall be appointed.

##### **Proposed Wording:**

1. Officers of this association shall consist of a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, and a Secretary-Treasurer. **A Statistician shall be appointed.**

## ARTICLE V (DUTIES OF OFFICERS)

### **Current wording:**

STATISTICIAN: Shall figure each entrant's ringer percentages and keep an up-to-date record of each pitcher's percentages. They shall send a current list to officials of the next sanctioned tournament upon request. They must be available to help tournament committees in whatever capacity is needed and forward all ISHPA tournament data to Nat-Stats.

*With NHPA eShoe this is no longer needed. **Delete all***

### Time & Expense Reimbursement

#### **Current Wording:**

Individuals mentioned in the positions below shall receive an annual stipend to defray the expenses of using their home, utilities, and equipment in serving their elected or appointed positions.

Sec.-Treas. \$1.25 per ISHPA member, plus costs of needed supplies.

Statistician \$1.25 per ISHPA member or \$.25 per entry, whichever is higher

*With eShoe delete last sentence*

#### **Proposed wording:**

Individuals mentioned in the positions below shall receive an annual stipend to defray the expenses of using their home, utilities, and equipment in serving their elected or appointed positions.

Sec.-Treas. ~~\$1.25~~ **\$1.50** per ISHPA member, plus costs of needed supplies.

~~Statistician \$1.25 per ISHPA member or \$.25 per entry, whichever is higher~~

Brian Poole made a motion to increase the pay to the sec-treas to \$1.50 as the statistician will not be paid anymore. Motion was seconded and passed.

## ARTICLE XI (Tournaments)

### **Current wording:**

All tournaments that are to be sanctioned must meet the following requirements:

1. Sanctions are to be issued annually through the Regional Director. Deadlines for accepting schedules for sanctioned tournaments will be December 1 of prior year with the exception of newly formed clubs.
2. All entrants, including Juniors (17 years of age and younger), must be members of the ISHPA and NHPA.
3. It shall be the duty of the tournament director to check membership cards of all entrants to verify eligibility into the tournament.
4. All scores should be kept accurately by a third-party scorekeeper if possible.
5. Summary sheets or computer data must be sent to the State Statistician within seventy -two (72) hours of completion of the tournament. Two dollars (\$2.00) for each tournament adult player must be sent to the Sec-Treas., (\$1.00) for the State Tournament fund and (\$1.00) for the State Trophy fund to be used by Hosting Club to provide State Trophies.
6. Scores will be kept for all sanctioned tournaments and ringers percentages recorded for permanent records and inclusion into the Nat-Stats database.
7. A minimum fee of 50 cents shall be paid by each pitcher to the scorekeeper at the beginning of the game.

### **Proposed Wording:**

All tournaments that are to be sanctioned must meet the following requirements:

1. Sanctions are to be issued annually through the Regional Director. Deadlines for accepting schedules for sanctioned tournaments will be December 1 of prior year with the exception of newly formed clubs.
2. All entrants, including Juniors (17 years of age and younger), must be members of the ISHPA and **/or** NHPA.
3. It shall be the duty of the tournament director to check membership ~~cards~~ of all entrants to verify eligibility into the tournament.
4. All scores should be kept accurately by a third-party scorekeeper if possible.
5. Summary sheets or computer data must be **submitted using HSMaster to eShoe or** sent to the State **Statistician Secretary** within seventy -two (72) hours of completion of the tournament. Two dollars (\$2.00) for each tournament

adult player must be sent to the Sec-Treas., (\$1.00) for the State Tournament fund and (\$1.00) for the State Trophy fund to be used by Hosting Club to provide State Trophies.

6. Scores will be kept for all sanctioned tournaments and ringers percentages recorded for permanent records and inclusion into the ~~Nat-Stats~~ **NHPA eShoe** database.

7. A minimum fee of 50 cents shall be paid by each pitcher to the scorekeeper at the beginning of the game.

#### ARTICLE XIII (State Doubles)

##### **Current Wording:**

1. To be eligible to pitch in the State Doubles Tournament a pitcher must have pitched in at least one tournament in the last 12 months.
2. 100% cap is utilized. (Total percentage of both partners not to exceed 100%)
3. Doubles will be a mixed tournament with no restrictions.
4. Play to consist of a walking doubles, round robin format. Play may consist of double rounds, but should attempt to finish in one day if possible. Games can be either points or shoes, but players should get at least 160 shoes pitched.

##### **Proposed Wording:**

1. To be eligible to pitch in the State Doubles Tournament a pitcher must have pitched in at least one **sanctioned** tournament in the last 12 months.
2. 100% cap is utilized. (Total percentage of both partners not to exceed 100%)
3. Doubles will be a mixed tournament with no restrictions.
4. Play to consist of a walking doubles, round robin format. Play may consist of double rounds, but should attempt to finish in one day if possible. Games can be either points or shoes, but players should get at least ~~160~~ **150** shoes pitched.

Jim Price moved to accept all of the proposed Bylaws amendments, the motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

**2022 Schedule:** The schedule for 2022 was skipped.

**2022 Tournament Sites:** Pocatello said they would host State Doubles. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept Pocatello as the 2022 State Doubles Host. No date was mentioned.

Coeur d'Alene offered to host the 2022 State Singles tournament the weekend after Labor Day. It was moved, seconded, and approved to have Coeur d'Alene host in 2022 the weekend after Labor Day and that the rotation would go to Pocatello, Meridian then back to Coeur d'Alene.

**State Singles Tournament Registration Fee:** The ISHPA Bylaws indicate that the "State Tournament entry fee for adult members shall be decided at the previous annual state meeting." A motion was made to increase the entry fee of the State Singles Championship from \$20.00 to \$25.00 with \$20 going to the prize fund and the remaining \$5.00 to go to the host club to help defray the cost of the food for the luncheon before the state meeting. The motion was seconded and approved.

##### **Election of Officers:**

The two-year terms for the 1<sup>st</sup> vice president and the secretary-treasurer are due for election. Carey Jennings had indicated in the newsletter that she would be running for the position of 1<sup>st</sup> vice president. No nominations from the floor. Motion was made to accept Carey Jennings as 1<sup>st</sup> vice president. Unanimous from all the people attending.

Carol Plummer had indicated in the newsletter that she would run for the position of secretary-treasurer. Clyde Marquez nominated Melanie Poole for the secretary-treasurer position, she accepted the nomination. Ballots were distributed for the secretary-treasurer position, members entered the name of the candidate they were voting for on the ballot. Votes were counted by David Spears and Brent Wood. Results of the vote were 15 for Melanie and 13 for Carol. Melanie will begin her two-year term as secretary-treasurer on January 1, 2022. The ballots (filled and blank) were not secured in case of a challenge to the election process or election results. No vote was taken to destroy the ballots.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:50 pm.
