News of "The World" Report

I had the chance to go to the World Tournament this year for the entire two weeks, and aside from the flies (very numerous in warm weather) the tournament was well run. I would like to thank Kim Peterson and his entire staff along with all the NHPA officers for their work to make the tournament successful. It appears that Winnemucca would like to host the World Tournament again.

I want to recognize some Idaho people who helped to make the tournament run smoothly. Teri Oppen, Teresa Brown and Carol Plummer helped out by scorekeeping. Pep Plummer arrived early to work with the court setup and then court teardown at the end. Pep also served as a judge and worked with the shoe check-in. Also, I would like to recognize Brian and Melanie Poole for all they did. Melanie helped out a tremendous amount with the stats and other roles she had. Brian was busy since he is the NHPA 1st Vice President. Idaho was well represented with members taking on many tasks that helped run the tournament. In addition, 43 ISHPA pitchers participated and many did well.

On Sunday morning of the tournament there was a delegates meeting to conduct necessary NHPA business. There was not much business other than election of some officers. The NHPA has a new President who starts on January 1, 2022; he is Gary Roberts, who was born into the game. Dalton Rackstraw was retained as the 5th Vice President. Barb Carson was elected to the 4th V.P. position and also takes over the Regional Director Director position. There was also talk about the 2024 World to which Laurie Lampkin mentioned at that time there were 12 sites bidding on it. But later in the week I personally chatted with her while on my BEMER chairs and she told me that two more sites jumped on board to bid, making the new total 14.



During the Sunday evening Hall of Fame banquet Idaho was recognized with three (3!) awards. The first award presented was a Membership Award for the 2018/2019 season. Thanks to the membership recruitment effort of Carey Jennings for the Gate City Club, Idaho saw a large increase in membership. It was my honor to accept the award on behalf of the ISHPA.

Horseshoeing Around by Carey Jennings, 1st Vice President



Another World Horseshoe Tournament is behind us. It is always such an exciting event. We work hard all year long; we work on our pitching trying to get better, keep trying to perfect our throw, our stance, our swing, our follow-through, etc. Making sure to get the required number of tournaments in is first on our minds, then making sure we meet the registration deadline, then practicing for the next few months, then getting the highly anticipated schedule, and getting our accommodations set, and the time off work, then finally the tournament is here and it is time to go! The excitement and anticipation are thrilling, as well as a little stressful. But, now that it is all said and done for another year, it is a good time to reflect on how it all went and what we all thought.

This was only my 3rd world tournament. I have been excited about going to this one ever since it was announced to be in Winnemucca, knowing it would be close enough to drive to. I think what I was most excited about was that Pocatello had 25 people registered and Idaho had 43 total registered. That was very awesome!! It was really neat having someone from Idaho in most of the time frames. While I was there watching Steve Cornwell (Pocatello), Brandon Beall (Hailey), and Ray Abrego Jr. (Lewiston) pitch in their division I could walk down the row and see Rick Sprague (Pocatello) pitching, then walk a little further and see Brian Poole (Pocatello) pitching, then go to the end and see Steve Lewis (Pocatello), Tom Shawcroft (Pocatello), Ross Medrano (Pocatello) and Ty Byington (Hailey) pitching in their division, and not to forget Carol Plummer (Boise) and Teresa Brown (Pocatello) in the chairs keeping score and Pep Plummer (Boise) out there in his bright orange vest as our judge and Melanie Poole (Pocatello) hard at work in the stats room. And, that was all just in the one time slot! Idaho had a great showing, which made it so much more fun.

Another part that was very exciting was all the “newbies” that went. Newbie in a sense that many had just signed up for the first time with our local club, with the state, and with NHPA this year or just in this past year and already went to their first world tournament! I have been to 2 others, St. George 2013 and St. George 2017 and I remember from the first one walking into the arena for the first time was so overwhelming. We are all used to pitching outside, with no ceiling and no walls, but that scene of seeing all the courts set up in an indoors venue for the first time was quite exciting and quite intimidating, and then actually pitching on the pits for the first time was equally intimidating. I have to say, it took me quite a few games to get into the groove and get my eyes and arm into the same swing, and I know that the all newbies or first timers this year felt the same.

Mary Blattner and her sister Vicky Lynn signed up with Gate City Horseshoe Pitchers together last year, even though the year was a short one because of Covid restrictions. Right from the start they were excited about the sanctioned tournaments and tried not to miss any of them. They were also excited to go to their first world tournament and worked diligently to meet the requirements needed. Because they both ended up in the same time slot, they were able to go together and experience it for the first time together. Tom and Jaimie Shawcroft also joined GCHPA last year. They were equally excited for all the tournaments and were anxious to go to their first world tournament together, as well. I asked each of them to write about their experience, so the rest of us could see it for the first time again, and they did not disappoint!

Vicky Lynn - I haven't been throwing shoes for very long, but I have been around the horseshoe crowd for a few years now because my sister has been pitching in the bar leagues for about a decade now. Horseshoe people are the best crowd ever! They are always welcoming, supportive, and encouraging. They want you to have fun, to improve, and look at the positives. There are those that step up when they see you struggling and give encouragement and advice, which, being new to the game are always welcome.

Last year I went from being a sub if a bar league team was in a pinch and needed someone at the last second, to playing bar league myself. I then joined the Gate City Horseshoe Pitchers Association and started going to a lot of sanctioned and non-sanctioned tournaments held in my area with my sister. This led us to deciding to go to Worlds the following year in Winnemucca anxious to see what it was like, especially since it was the closest to home in had been in a long time.

My sister and I drove to Winnemucca the day before our division sessions began. We checked out the Event Center and ran into friends from home that were already there competing. We checked out the practice barn and spent few hours getting used to the clay and finding our throwing spots. That clay is amazing!! We left the practice pits not feeling so terrified about going up against the competition from all over the country. We got to the hotel and hung out with friends and then got a goodnight's sleep.

When we arrived the next morning, we went and checked in and got our 2 pair of horseshoes checked out to make sure they were competition quality and then sent to orientation and team pictures. Once all of that was done, we picked up our paperwork that told us what court we were playing on and who all we were throwing against in that day's session. Then, the nerves and terror started up again as I went into my first game. But I kicked ass!! I won 22-4 AND I threw a double! I then turned around and had my ass handed to me in the next game, which kind of balanced me out. I lost the next 2 also, but I still threw the best I have ever thrown! Before the session was complete on our first day, I threw one more double and I threw ringers I never knew I could. I learned that if I just keep my eye on the pin, my shoe will find a way to get there. I nearly doubled my average my first day, so I wasn't feeling so bad that I only won one game that day. I also got to watch my sister's last game each day and she really kicked some ass and took names! I was really proud of her.

Our last day ended with me ranking higher than when I arrived. My sister took 2nd in her division (when she should have got first). I had a ton of fun, met people from all over the country, learned how to score with the electronic scoring, got to see a lot of great pitching from a variety of divisions and ages of pitchers. There were 11- year-olds there that could smoke any adult that came along. It was amazing and unbelievable to watch. Friends and family that could not come to Winnemucca were able to watch online, which was awesome. The whole thing was an unforgettable experience. I hope I get to do it again!

Mary Blattner – I've been throwing horseshoes for about 20 years, a lot of which was just backyard throwing. I love playing the game and should've dedicated more time to it than I have. Raising two girls was more of a priority, but I did play as often as I could, mostly on weekends at family BBQs and things like that.

I throw a reverse 3/4 turn, which I had no idea what that even meant for a long time. I just knew I threw a different shoe than anyone else I've played against here in town. Over the years I've had many, many people ask me how I even do it, because the way I hold it looks like I'm going to throw a flip shoe. I couldn't tell you to this day how I do it. What I've always told everyone is, "I don't know, that's just how it comes out of my hand." I got a lot of the same questions at World's. So many people asked me about it, even the NHPA president. I was shocked, to say the least, at how many people noticed, commented, and told me how pretty it was, and also how crazy it was that I throw my shoe like that. It made me giggle.

I've always heard people talk about how "nerves took over" or "my nerves got the best of me" and I've never understood what that exactly meant until right before my very first game at Worlds in Winnemucca. I was a little nervous as I was warming up for my first game, but after the Pledge of Allegiance was said and the announcer said to flip your shoe and begin, the only way I can describe how I felt was that it felt like someone hit me with a cattle prod. I instantly knew what I've heard so many times from people about their nerves setting in. My heart was racing about 100 mph, I had goosebumps, I was sweating, and it all lasted for about an hour. I could not calm down.

In spite of my beginning nerves, I had a great weekend, met a lot of really nice people from all over the country, and played some of my best games ever! I ended up taking second in my division, which I was more than happy about. After many, many years of talking about the World Tournament with friends and then finally deciding to make the decision to go, I'm really happy that I did!

Jamie Shawcroft - I was really excited when I found out how close Worlds was going to be to us and I knew I had to go! It was definitely an eye-opening experience for me. It's a little daunting to walk in and see all of the pits out on the floor. I feel like I was a little unprepared for my experience, but I now know what to expect and that I need to put in a lot more practice and work for the next one that I attend. Hopefully, my nerves will be a little better next time as well! It was fun to meet all of the different ladies that I played against from all of the different places around the country. There were some very sweet and talented gals.

Tom Shawcroft - It was different. You put the words "World Championship" in front of something and it changes it. I hadn't thrown in front of more than a Sunday at Duffy's Bar (maximum 16 people) before Worlds. My nerves got to me a little more than I actually expected they would...which usually happened about halfway through a game I was winning. The group of guys I got to throw with were fun. It didn't feel as serious, which did make it easier to adjust to the atmosphere. All in all, I had a good time, I won some games, I finished in the top half of my class, I learned a little about myself and the game of horseshoes.

Hopefully, that spark of excitement continues in all of us. And hopefully, we can all enjoy our games of horseshoes and get back to that "newbie" feeling again. See you all on the pits!!
